## **Protecting** Tenants

Parliament passes legislation to protect tenants during the Cost of Living Crisis

John was pleased to support the Government in bringing forward a bill which will protect renters from exploitative rent increases and eviction over the challenging winter months.

This policy will be in place, in the first case, till March 2023. Tenants, namely private renters, are often some of the most at risk to the ongoing Cost of Living Crisis Though John supports the bill fully, he and other colleagues, expressed concern about the effect this will have on housing associations and home building. The Scottish Government assured consultation with the sector has taken place on this issue.

## St Mungo's Museum

John visited the re-opened St Mungo's Museum.

The reopening was for the 40th anniversary of Stella Reekie's death. She is attributed to be the founder of interfaith relations in modern Scotland. an issue John is passionate about in his role as convenor of the Cross Party Group on Freedom of Religion or Belief.

John met online with Scottish Enterprise about the ambitions and work they are doing to attract more investment to the Glasgow area while also supporting companies through the difficult economic situation currently. Scottish Enterprise hope to make Scotland a European location for investment with new market opportunities.

While out and about in the constituency, John was pleased to see the progress of the new health and social care hub across from The Forge. The facility will also be providing community spaces such as bookable rooms, library and cafe facilities.
