#### **NIMS**

John recently visited the National Manufacturing Institute Scotland (NMIS) Group alongside members of the Finance Committee. The visit provided valuable insight into the development of their site near Glasgow Airport and the organisation's wider strategic goals. During the visit, discussions focused on the benefits of clustering industries, the challenges and opportunities of scaling up businesses, and the role of both public and private finance in supporting innovation. The group also explored the importance of creating and sustaining skilled jobs within Scotland's manufacturing sector.

### **Drug Consumption Statement**

John was saddened to hear about the high number of drug-related deaths in Scotland, as highlighted in a statement by his colleague Maree Todd MSP. While there is a fall in deaths from 2023 to 2024 by around 155, this figure remains far too high. John acknowledges the life-saving work of the Thistle Drug Consumption Room (near the Barras) and welcomes its contribution, but also stresses that more time and evaluation are needed to fully understand its long-term impact.

#### **Residential Outdoor Education Bill**

John has been actively involved in scrutinising the Residential Outdoor Education Bill as part of the Education and Young People's Committee. He welcomes the principles behind the Bill, which aims to ensure that all children have the opportunity to access outdoor education during their time in school. John recognises the many benefits outdoor learning can offer young people in terms of wellbeing, engagement, and personal development. However, he believes that how this provision is funded and fairly distributed across schools and local authorities should be targeted at less affluent families. An important issue that requires further discussion and careful consideration.

He emphasised the importance of core democratic values such as freedom, equality, participation, and the rule of law as essential foundations of a fair and just society.
