

The Glasgow City Council (City Centre) (Traffic Management) Order 2010 (Variation No.54) (High Street) Order 202_

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above-named Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

Background to the proposed Order

As a consequence of the proposals to redevelop High Street, where the existing road layout will be reconfigured to create a "tree lined" avenue with a new segregated cycle track on the northwest side of High Street for its full length and on the south side of Rottenrow East, this TRO will be required to make amendments to the existing waiting and loading restrictions as well as traffic movement restrictions appropriate to the proposed road layout.

The roads affected by these proposals are: High Street and Rottenrow East.

As part of this Variation Order, disabled parking spaces will be introduced on Dundasvale Court in the Cowcaddens area of Glasgow city centre.

Details of the proposals are as follows:

- Amendments to existing waiting, loading and parking restrictions on High Street due to proposed road layout alterations.
- Addition of a new two-way segregated cycle track along the northwest side of High Street, and south side of Rottenrow East.
- One-way operation (eastwards) on Rottenrow East.
- New disabled parking spaces on Dundasvale Court.
